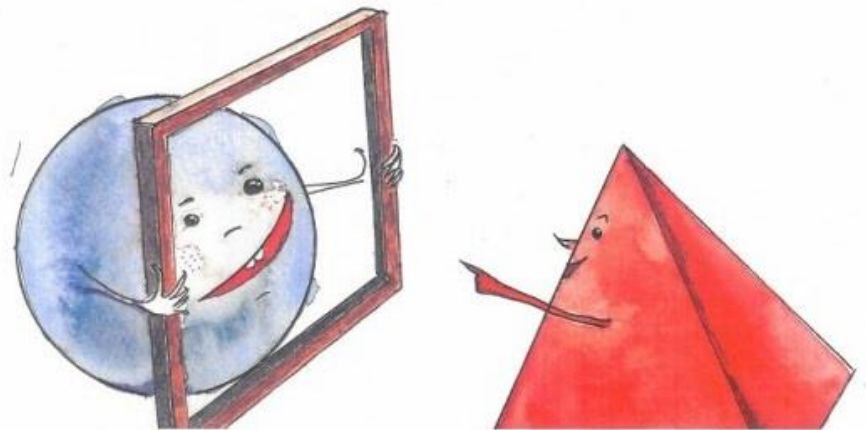

WHAT IS TOLERANCE?

Tolerance is a term that means patience and respect for social, cultural, sexual or religious differences.

According to some philosophical dictionaries, it can manifest itself as an act of leniency, an act of patience, or an act of support and understanding.



Tolerance is a moral value that implies the full respect of others, their ideas, practices or beliefs, whether different from ours.



In this sense, it is recognition of the differences inherent in human nature, the diversity of cultures, religions, or behaviors.

Tolerance is considered by some to be a fundamental value for a harmonious peaceful coexistence.

Tolerance is thought to be at the heart of good relationships between people of different cultures, religions, races and lifestyles.



DEFINITION OF HUMAN RIGHTS

Human rights are ethical principles or social norms that set certain standards of human behavior and are protected as legal rights by local and international law. They are usually regarded as inalienable fundamental rights which "every person has at birth only because he or she is a human being" and which are "inherent in all human beings", regardless of their nationality, location, language, religion, ethnicity origin or any other status.



They are applicable everywhere and at any time in the sense that they are universal, and they are egalitarian in the sense that they are the same for everyone. They require compassion and the rule of law and impose on each person the duty to respect the rights of others.



TYPES OF TOLERANCE

- **Religious Tolerance** - The idea is that different religions and beliefs can exist without conflict with each other, the dialogue between different religions and the harmonious coexistence are encouraged.



- **Political tolerance** - the diversity of interests and opinions in politics is enormous, which is why we need patience and a desire to respect different political views.



- **Racial and Ethnic Tolerance**



There is still racial discrimination in the world and even the belief that some races and nations are God-chosen.

Racial and ethnic tolerance calls for respect for the rights of all races and ethnicities and for respect for their history and culture

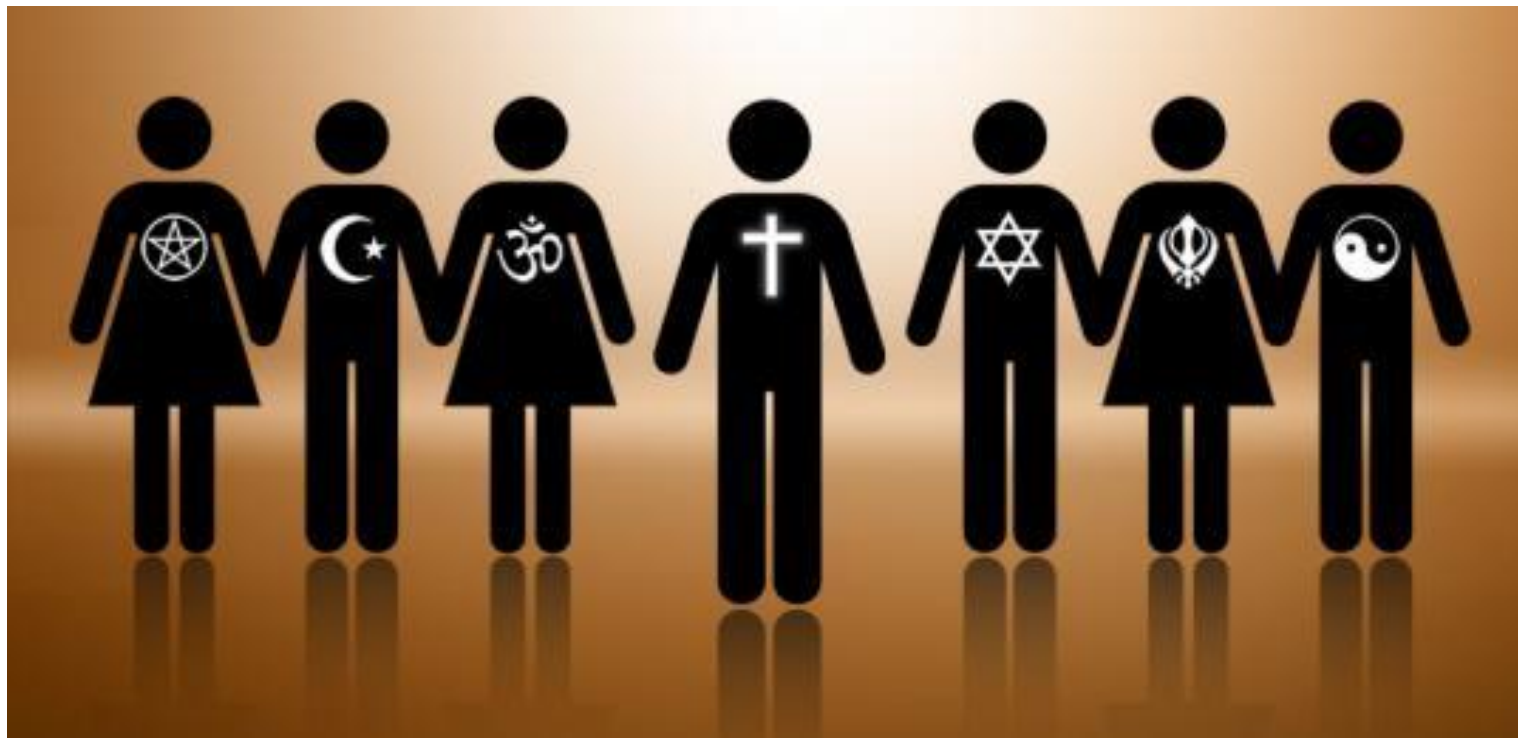
EXAMPLES OF TOLERANCE

One of the most striking examples of tolerance in Bulgarian's history is the rescue of 50,000 Bulgarian Jews in the years of World War II.

At that time our country was an ally of Germany, but thanks to the efforts of the Bulgarian Orthodox Church, politicians, public figures, cultural figures and the solidarity of ordinary Bulgarians, deportation to the death camps was not happening.



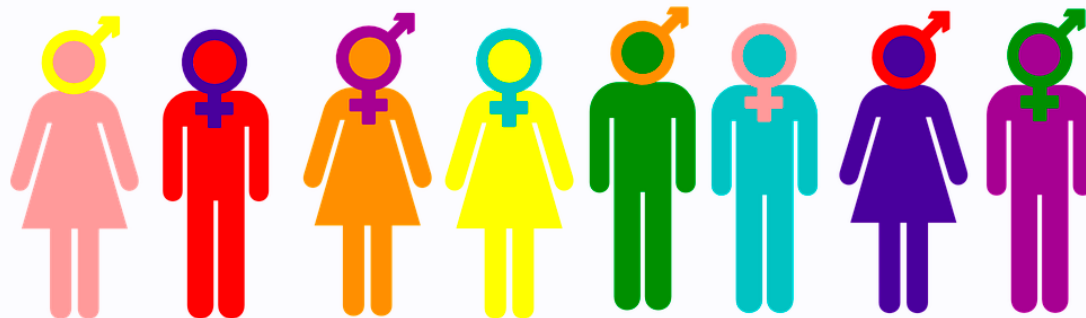
Vidin has its Jerusalem. Intolerance

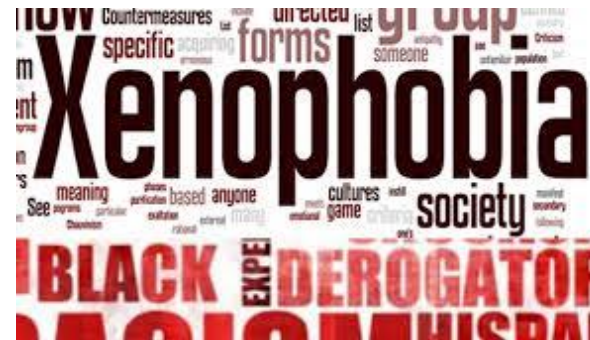

It also involves the rejection of people whom we perceive as different, for example members of a social or ethnic group other than ours, or people who are different in political or sexual orientation. Intolerance can manifest itself in a wide range of actions from avoidance through hate speech to physical injury or even murder.

Forms of intolerance

- ✓ **Xenophobia** - The Oxford English Dictionary defines xenophobia as "a morbid fear of foreigners or foreign countries".



- ✓ **Racism** – Racial discrimination is an unequal treatment of individuals on the basis of real or imaginary racial categories.



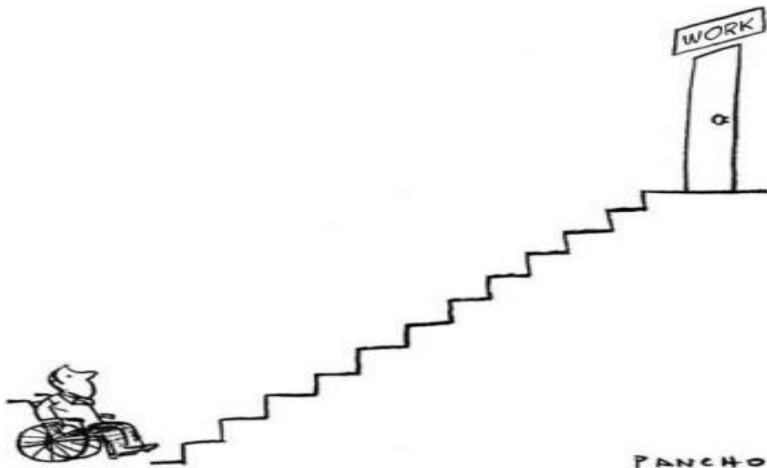
- ✓ **Intolerance based on religion-** Religious discrimination is the finding of unequal treatment of individuals on the basis of their religious beliefs or affiliation.
